

ORDINANCE NO. 92

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BARRETT, MONROE COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 73, ALSO KNOWN AS THE POLICE PENSION FUND ORDINANCE, ADOPTED ON DECEMBER 14, 1977.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Barrett Township, on December 10, 1986, adopted Ordinance No. 91, which enrolled the uniformed employees of the Township of Barrett in the Pennsylvania Municipal Retirement System, effective January 1, 1987; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors wishes to repeal the existing Ordinance No. 73, which established and regulated the Police Pension Plan for the regular members of the police force of the Township of Barrett, which was enacted on December 14, 1977;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Board of Supervisors of Barrett Township, Monroe County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same:


SECTION 1: Ordinance No. 73 of Barrett Township, also known as the Police Pension Fund Ordinance, is hereby repealed in its entirety.

SECTION 2: All ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.


SECTION 3: This Ordinance shall take effect five (5) days from the date of its enactment.

Dear Ms. LaBar:

We take this opportunity to share with you the enclosed Addendum that was executed almost a year ago for the Barrett Township Police Pension Plan. As you may recall, under State law you had to execute an agreement authorizing the waiver of the member contributions to the police pension plan during 1990, this having been done through the adoption of the Addendum dated December 27, 1989, the document which is enclosed.

While we had originally anticipated it would take approximately eight weeks to process the Addendum through the Attorney General's Office, as you can see, it has taken more like eight months. We regret any inconvenience that this may have caused you.

If you anticipate waiving member contributions in 1991 as well, please so notify us and we will be happy to provide you with a sample addendum and ordinance. The one piece of good news is that our attorneys have revised their considerations and have agreed that in future years, with appropriate addendum in the agreement, revisions can be done by resolution as opposed to ordinance. We would be happy to assist you in preparing language and trust that you will feel free to call upon our resources if you so desire.
